**Whakanuia te wiki o Te Reo Māori
Māori Language Week 26th July Term 3**

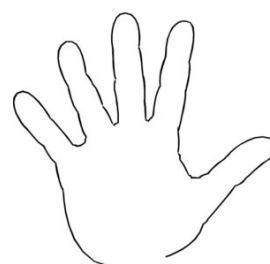
To celebrate the importance of Māori language and culture, a range of activities are being organised to take place during Māori Language Week, one of which is a Form Class Waka.

All form classes will create their own waka (canoe). This idea comes from Year 11 Students Esme Hunt and Tyler Nikora. The waka symbolises the journey that Paraparaumu College students are making. It emphasises the importance of the individual understanding their language, culture and ancestry and moving forward as part of the community. The aim is to generate discussion within the Paraparaumu community and give all students the opportunity to write Te Reo Māori. All students will have the opportunity to write their own Mihimihi in Te Reo Māori (this includes writing your name, how you came to NZ, your mountain/river, your ancestry) and contribute towards creating a class waka poster to be displayed in all classrooms.

To support the students, please discuss their ancestry (if you know it!) or help them come to logical conclusions about their cultural background. This will help them write their Mihimihi as modelled below.

Mihimihi

1. Ko **Tokomaru** te waka (**Tokomaru** is my canoe)
2. Ko **Taranaki** te maunga (**Taranaki** is my mountain)
3. Ko **Mimi** te awa (**Mimi** is my river)
4. Ko **Ngāti Mutunga** te iwi (I'm a descendant of **Mutunga**)



5. Ko *Te Kapinga Makarati* te whānau ingoa (My family name is *Te Kapinga Makarati*)
6. Ko *Te Amoroa* tōku ingoa (My name is *Te Amoroa*)

Support for writing Mihimihi

1. **How your ancestors arrived in NZ:**

Ko *Tokomaru* te waka (*Tokomaru* is my canoe)

Manurere = aeroplane

Kaipuke = ship

2. A **mountain** that you consider important for you or your family
3. A **river or ocean** that you consider important for you or your family
4. **Your tribe or ancestors.** This could be:

Pakeha

Anglo Saxon

Entries, together with the fees received, will be sent to NZQA (New Zealand Qualifications Authority) shortly after 1st September. Any student who has not paid after the payments and entries have been sent will need to pay directly to NZQA and will incur a **\$50.00 late fee**.

TERTIARY INFORMATION – particularly for students in Year 13

Liaison Visits

Liaison officers from Otago, Victoria, Canterbury, Massey, Lincoln, Waikato and Auckland Universities have visited the College. Most of these officers return later in the year to assist students to plan specific courses at their University of choice. There has also been a visit from Whitireia and Weltec Polytechnics and the Air Force.

Applications for Tertiary Study

Students intending to continue their study at any tertiary establishment (University, Polytechnic or private provider) should make sure that they are aware of any closing dates for their particular course. Students requiring help should contact Mrs Browne.

Copies of each University's Prospectus or a Guide to Study are forwarded to the College as they become available and are issued to students. In some cases the University forwards them directly to students. Students should use this information to make a decision on what kind of course they intend to follow. More specific information comes with the Course Enrolment Packs which arrive later. Students should be aware that Universities are increasingly putting application and information on-line.

Halls of Residence

Application forms for Halls of Residence at the various Universities have started to arrive. Mrs Browne is advising through the notices and assemblies as they become available. These applications have to be at the Universities by 1st October, which is during the third term holiday. Students are responsible for sending off their part of the application and the College Common Confidential Reference forms are sent off by Mrs Lawry, Principal's Secretary, separately. The school has a lot of work to do on these forms and thus we ask that the Common Confidential Reference forms to be given in to the Office as soon as possible.

Students may apply for a Hall of Residence at more than one University and should apply even if there is some doubt whether they require a place or not.

University Visits

Year 13 students will be given the opportunity to visit either Massey University on 4th August at Palmerston North or Victoria and/or Massey Universities in Wellington on 27th August to get an insight into the courses and other aspects of University life. This is an excellent opportunity to get many questions answered. Students are advised to decide which of the visits they are going to take advantage of. Any student wishing to visit both Universities, or a University and the Career Expo will need to apply in writing to Mrs Browne explaining why they wish to visit both.

Testimonials

Year 13 students are able to receive a College Testimonial when they leave. To ensure that testimonials are completed by the end of the College year, we have issued students applying for a Hall or Residence or a Hostel with a pink testimonial pack. These packs need to have been returned by tomorrow (Friday 25th June). The testimonial information is used as the basis for any "Halls of Residence" confidential reports. Students who do not intend applying for a Hall of Residence/Hostel have also been given a testimonial pack.

Year 12 students who intend leaving at the end of the year can also obtain a testimonial if they wish. Details can be obtained from the Year 12 Deans.

Years 12 – 13 Careers Expo

Again this year our senior careers programme will be integrated with the Wellington Careers EXPO on Tuesday 17th August at the TSB Bank Arena, Jervois Quay.

This Expo will have representatives from the main tertiary establishments together with various training and career providers. This gives Year 12's particularly, an ideal opportunity to compare the different courses offered and to assist them in making choices for their future. Prior to the event, students will be provided with a copy of the seminars and exhibitors available, and parent(s)/caregiver(s) are encouraged to look at this with their son/daughter to help them plan their day and to accompany them if they wish.

There will be no Year 12 classes on this day but if students do not intend to go to the Expo they report to the College where study rooms will be available. A newsletter outlining the exact procedure will be issued closer to the event.

Year 13 students are reminded that normal classes continue for them that day. Anyone who wishes to attend the Careers Expo again needs to get a special permission slip from Mrs Browne or Mr Boccock.

PARAPARAUMU COLLEGE ENROLMENT SCHEME (A reprint from the last newsletter)

The following confirms the current home zone for the College.

Paraparaumu College Geographical Home Zone

The area of the Kapiti Coast bounded on the west by the sea and on the east by the Tararua Ranges with northern and southern boundaries defined as follows:

a) West of State Highway 1

Northern Boundary All properties in Te Kowhai/Gary Road
 Southern Boundary Kapiti Road including all properties with a Kapiti Road address, but excluding properties on roads joining Kapiti Road from the south.

b) East of State Highway 1

Northern Boundary Hadfield Road
 Southern Boundary The intersection of the State Highway 1 and Ruahine Street at Boat City.

Note The eastern boundary in Waikanae is at the summit of Akatarawa Road.

The Board will determine the number of out-of-zone places which may be available for 2011 before the ballot on 20th August.

There are some important dates which out-of-zone applicants must be aware of. These include:

19th June	Public Notice relating to out-of-zone pre-enrolments for Year 9 students 2011 to appear in the Dominion Post.
2nd August	Final date for out-of-zone pre-enrolments for Year 9 students in 2011 to be with the College.
20th August	Ballot for places in Year 9, 2011 to be held at Tawa College for all schools with enrolment schemes in the Greater Wellington area.
25th August	All parents of out-of-zone pre-enrolments for Year 9, 2011 advised of ballot outcomes.
8th September	Final date for receipt of acceptance letters from parents of students offered places via the ballot.
2nd October	Public Notice relating to out-of-zone pre-enrolments in Years 10-13, 2011 to appear in the Dominion Post.
29th October	Final date for out-of-zone pre-enrolments for Year 10-13 students in 2011 to be with the College.
5th November	Ballot for places in Years 10-13 in 2011 to be held if necessary.
10th November	All parents of out of zone pre-enrolments for Year 10 – 13 2011 advised of ballot outcomes.
Late November/Early December	Another application round for out-of-zone students, at any level for 2011, may occur if places are available.

Ballot procedure

Should the number of out-of-zone pre-enrolments exceed the number of places available then a ballot will take place based on the following priority order:

- 1 Siblings of current students of Paraparaumu College
- 2 Siblings of former students of Paraparaumu College
- 3 Sons/daughters of Paraparaumu College Board of Trustees employees
- 4 Other students

Procedure for offering places

All students will be placed in a rank order based on these priorities and any places available will be offered to those first on the rank order list until the available places are reached. Other students will then form the waiting list and parents will be informed of their place on the rank order.

Importance of meeting deadline for out-of-zone applications for pre-enrolment

It is vital that any out-of-zone pre-enrolments are with the College by the due dates. Failure to do so will result in any late applications being invalid. No late out-of-zone applications are permitted under the current legislation even if places are available.

Importance of replying to offers of ballot places for out-of-zone students by the required date

It is also vital that successful balloted students accept the offer of an out-of-zone place by the due date otherwise the place is forfeited and it will be offered to the next person on the list. Once a place is declined, or not accepted by the due date, it will make the application invalid for that year, and reconsideration is not possible.

Important message from the Board regarding possible places for out-of-zone students in 2011

The Board would wish to indicate that all out-of-zone applicants in 2009 were offered places for 2010. The Board will consider its position relating to enrolment numbers closer to the ballot and it hopes to be able to offer places to those students wishing to enrol at Paraparaumu College for 2011.

It is critical that any parent wishing to enrol their son/daughter for 2011 **must** ensure that applications for pre-enrolment are received by the dates indicated in the list above. Applications received after the cut-off date(s) cannot be actioned.

In Zone Students

Any student living within the school zone may enrol, and commence attendance, at any time of the year and is not subject to any restrictions on enrolment.

PROSPECTUS AND ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

The College prospectus for 2011 has been printed and issued to all Year 8 students in the district. The orientation programme for Year 8 students is occurring Friday (tomorrow), Monday and Tuesday. Please try to have 2011 Year 9 pre-enrolment forms completed and returned to local primary schools by 23rd July 2010. We will collect them from the local schools.

All pre-enrolment applications from **out-of-zone students** for Year 9 places in 2011 **must** be with the College by 2nd August 2010.

PROPERTY

The usual tidy up around the College will take place during the school holidays.
